This catastrophic event caused tsunamis, leading to the collapse of <u>civilizations (10)</u> on nearby islands, potentially inspiring the Atlantis myth.

Despite its mythical nature, Atlantis remains a popular topic, with various theories and interpretations capturing the imagination of people worldwide.
